**Olive Beatrice Stanton Award for Excellence in Teaching**

**Eligibility:** an academic staff member with faculty rank who has taught at the University of Manitoba for up to 10 consecutive years.

This award recognizes an outstanding University of Manitoba educator who has demonstrated continuing teaching excellence and who has made contributions to advancing teaching and learning at the U of M. **The Award consists of a plaque and a monetary award of \$5,000.** The recipient will be included in the Spring Convocation Ceremony and will also deliver a presentation at the U of M New Faculty Orientation.

**Dr. and Mrs. H. H. Saunderson Award for Excellence in Teaching**

**Eligibility:** an academic staff member with faculty rank who has taught at the University of Manitoba for more than 10 consecutive years.

This award recognizes an outstanding University of Manitoba educator who has demonstrated continuing teaching excellence and who has made contributions to advancing teaching and learning at both the U of M and at the national or international level. **The Award consists of a plaque and a monetary award of \$10,000.** The recipient will be included in the Spring Convocation Ceremony and will also deliver a presentation at the U of M New Faculty Orientation.

**Who can nominate?**

For either award, nominations may be submitted by any current member of the University of Manitoba community (faculty, student, or staff) or by alumni who graduated in the preceding three years.

---

**Summary of the Process for Submitting a Nomination for either award:**

1. Obtain the nominee's permission;
2. Prepare, in collaboration with the nominee, a **two-page** submission representing an "executive summary" of the nominee's accomplishments that demonstrates that the nominee meets the award criteria and eligibility;
3. Submit the executive summary to Dr. Diane Hiebert-Murphy, Vice-Provost (Academic Affairs) **by February 9, 2018** (via email to [Norman.DelosReyes@umanitoba.ca](mailto:Norman.DelosReyes@umanitoba.ca), or mail to 208 Admin Building). Late submissions will not be accepted.
4. Once Dr. Hiebert-Murphy has recommended that the nomination move forward in the process, the nominator compiles a full nomination detailing the record of the nominee's accomplishments and submits the complete package by April 6, 2018. The Vice-Provost Awards Committee will then review the nominations and select the award winners.
