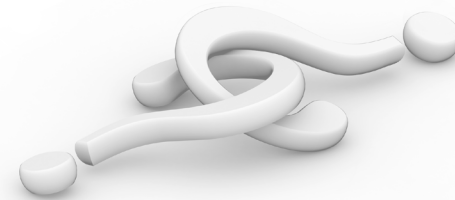

# Programs & Services

## **Certification in Higher Education Teaching (CHET)**

In cooperation with the Faculty of Graduate Studies, UTS offers the CHET program. CHET is designed to help academic departments prepare PhD students for a full range of faculty and professional responsibilities.

## **Consultation Services**

An extensive individual consultation service is provided to faculty members, administrators, and graduate students on a confidential basis.

## **Customized Workshops**

UTS facilitates customized workshops for individual departments and faculties.

## **New Faculty Orientation**

New Faculty are officially welcomed to the University of Manitoba at a New Faculty Orientation, held annually and sponsored by the Office of the President.

## **New Faculty Program**

The New Faculty Program is a comprehensive program designed to develop faculty teaching skills.

## **Peer Consultation Program**

This program is available to all teaching staff to support their teaching by working one-on-one in a confidential relationship with a trained faculty consultant.

## **Professional Development Workshops for Faculty**

Professional development workshops on teaching and learning are provided for faculty and sessional instructors throughout the year.

## **Professional Development Workshops for Graduate Students**

Professional development workshops on teaching and learning are provided for graduate students throughout the year.

## **Print Copies of Teaching Resources**

UTS has several publications including, Enhancing Student Learning, Teaching Tips, Developing Your Teaching Dossier, and Students Rating Teachers: How Student Feedback Can Inform Your Teaching (SEEQ booklet).

## **Spring Series**

In May of each year, UTS offers a series of workshops designed to develop effective teaching practices and to provide innovative teaching ideas and techniques.

## **Students' Teacher Recognition Reception**

This is an annual reception at which outstanding graduating students recognize two teachers who have made special contributions to their education, one from their K - 12 years, and one from their years at the U of M.

## **Teaching Assistant Orientation**

This practical workshop for Teaching Assistants (TAs) is sponsored by the individual faculties. Teaching Assistants receive practical advice on the role of TAs, dealing with common student issues, accommodating diversity, and a variety of teaching strategies.

## **Teaching At The University of Manitoba: A Handbook**

This handbook contains a wealth of practical ideas on teaching and learning. It is available at the U of M bookstore.

## **Teaching Resource Library**

UTS has a reference resource library with over 900 books and journals on a wide range of teaching and learning issues.
